TRANSFORMATIVE NEW LAWS

In Conclusion we can find changes in New Laws as transformative future for Indian Prisons, significant progress has been made in reducing the number of undertrial prisoners, enhancing prison administration, and expediting judicial processes. The provisions for mandatory bail and shorter detention durations have already made a tangible difference, easing the burden on the prison system

The efforts of the MHA, NCRB, BPRD, CDTIs, Police and Judicial academies and various Prison Training Institutes continue to ensure that prison staff receive the necessary training to effectively implement these reforms. Moving forward, the emphasis on rehabilitation, alongside continued investment in resources and training, will be crucial to the long-term success

of India's prison system

Currently, India's prison population exceeds 5,00,000, with over 1,300 prisons nationwide. A significant portion of these inmates are undertrial prisoners, often detained for extended periods without trial. The new laws have directly addressed these concerns, bringing substantial changes to both prison management and judicial

A major aspect of the new laws is their focus on reducing overcrowding caused by undertrial prisoners. The detention duration for first-time offenders has been significantly shortened, helping alleviate pressure on prison resources. In certain cases, first-time offenders who have already spent a considerable portion of their maximum sentence in detention are eligible for bail. This provision helps reduce unnecessary detention while ensuring judicial efficiency. Prison superintendents are now empowered to appeal directly to the court for expedited bail decisions, especially in

procedures.

For offenses punishable by life imprisonment or capital punishment, the provisions for release on bail are not applicable, ensuring that justice is upheld in severe These reforms have already begun to show their impact by reducing the number of undertrial prisoners, directly addressing the longstanding issue of overcrowding.

One of the most significant changes brought by the new laws is the introduction of strict timeframes for judicial proceedings. Serious crime investigations must be concluded within 60 days, and courts are required to issue verdicts within 45 days. This accelerated pace has resulted in faster case resolutions, benefiting both undertrial prisoners and the overall judicial process, while reducing prison overcrowding. Additionally, tools like the Sankalan app, developed by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), have empowered prison staff and law enforcement personnel by providing real-time updates on new legal provisions. A comprehensive series of training programs, organized through platforms such as iGOT Karmayogi and conducted by various law enforcement and prison training institutes, has further enhanced the capacity of prison staff to implement these reforms effectively.

In line with the legal

changes, India has also introduced significant administrative reforms within its prisons. The adoption of alternative punishments, such as community service for minor offenses, has contributed to reducing overcrowding. However, as judicial processes accelerate, the proportion of convicted prisoners is increasing, necessitating a greater focus on rehabilitation and correctional services.

The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has launched several initiatives to modernize prison systems. Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS) 2.0 enables seamless data sharing among police, courts, prosecution, prisons, and forensic departments, improving efficiency across the jus-

tice system. Digital Prison Management tools like the e-Prison Suite, inmate records and rehabilitation progress are now tracked digitally, ensuring transparency and streamlined management.

As the focus shifts toward convicted prisoners, the rehabilitation and reintegration of inmates have become a primary concern. The prison authorities are implementing several programs to prepare inmates for reintegration into society, including: Vocational Training and Education Programs are designed to equip inmates with skills that will make them employable upon release. Mental and Physical Health Services are now provided to inmates with comprehensive healthcare services, including counselling, yoga, and medical care, to promote overall well-being. Regular Monitoring through Digital Tools like National Prisons Information Portal (NPIP) has been introduced to enhance oversight and ensure that inmates' rehabilitation progress is continually moni-

While the ongoing reforms show great promise, however, Future Challenges and Opportunities remain to address like-The expedited verdict process could place additional pressure on courts, potentially affecting the quality of decisions. Successfully rolling out the ICJS and other digital tools across all prisons remains a critical task. Expanding correctional programs will require additional funding and skilled personnel to meet the growing demands for Rehabilitation.

IT, GST, UPI: Many rules changing from today

Several financial rule changes are going to come into effect from April 1, 2025 onwards, impacting UPI users, credit card holders, and pensioners across the country. A prominent rule change is that individuals earning up to ₹12 lakh/ annum exempted from paying income taxes. The NPCI has now mandated

that the UPI transactions from inactive numbers will not happen. The UPS will be implemented, replacing old pension system. The E-Way Bills (EWB) can only be generated for the documents which are not older than 180 days. Banks such as SBI, PNB, Canara Bank will update minimum balance requirements with customers who fail to maintain the revised balance facing penalties.

'Op Khushi-9' by Raj police to find missing minors

The Rajasthan Police will launch a state-level campaign called "Operation Khushi-9" to search for missing minors under the age of 18. The campaign will be conducted from April 1 to April 30. During this campaign, police personnel who demonstrate exceptional dedication and hard work will be rewarded, while those who show negligence and indifference will face disciplinary action.

Additional Director General of Police for Civil Rights and Anti-Human Trafficking, Malini Agarwal, stated that teams are being formed at the police station level for this campaign. Rajasthan Police has previously launched several campaigns to trace missing children, and through this initiative, comprehensive steps will be taken to locate the children as quickly as possible and reunite them with their families.

In light of the pending cases of missing children in Rajasthan, the campaign aims to reduce the number of unresolved cases. The special operation "Khushi IX" will be carried out at the state level across all districts from April 1, 2025, to April 30, 2025.

Agarwal emphasized that police personnel who work diligently to locate missing children will be rewarded, while those who display negligence or lack of commitment will face disciplinary actions. Additionally, district-level cyber cells will be incorporated to provide technical assistance for the campaign. Weekly progress reports from each district will be compiled and sent to the Missing Person Cell of the Civil Rights and AHT Branch at the Police Headquarters.





India dismisses NYT report on HAL-Russia ties as 'misleading'

India has rejected a report that alleged Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) supplied sensitive technology to a Russian arms agency, news agency ANI reported on Monday. The Ministry of External Affairs reportedly stated that the Indian entity (HAL) mentioned in the New York Times report has adhered to all international obligations on strategic trade controls and end-user commitments. "The said report is factually incorrect and misleading. It has tried to frame issues and distort facts to suit a political narrative," ANI quoted the MEA as saying.

Yunus: Bangladesh, the 'ocean guardian,' can boost China trade

by The New York Times Bangladesh interim government's Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus, who was on a four-day China visit, urged Beijing to make the ocean-facing part of Bangladesh an extension of the Chinese economy. In a video that went viral on social media, Yunus urged the Chinese government to set up its economic base in the country while saying that Dhaka was the only guardian of the ocean in that region.

"Seven states of India, Eastern part of India called seven sisters, they are landlocked country. They have no way to reach out to the ocean. We

This could be an extension of the Chinese economy - Built, produce and market things, bring it back to China, export to the rest of the world," said Yunus. Earlier, Yunus also said that it's important for Bangladesh to see China as a good friend.



s the child steps into this world – toys follow. Initially for amusement and engaging attention, they are gradually transformed into important interactive playsets designed to stimulate creativity and cognitive development in children.

Since times immemorial, toys have been an integral part of childhood. The earliest-known written historical mention of a toy comes from about 500 BCE in a Greek reference to yo-yos made from wood, metal, or painted terra-cotta. But that was then.

toy industry saw a shift from small-scale, handcrafted production to a global powerhouse of toy exports, when economic reforms opened the door to

foreign investment & trade. But closer home the toy industry saw a renaissance when Prime Minister in his Mann Ki Baat on August 30th 2020, highlighted the great potential of Indian Toys. PM Narendra Modi encouraged Indians especially start-ups to be "vocal for local toys", citing the nation's rich heritage and traditions that could

drive innovations in the global toy industry. And

that changed it all.

According to data, the value of toys imported by India plummeted from US\$ 371 million in FY19 to US\$ 110 million in FY22, a drop of more than 70%. Quick on the trot Indian entrepreneurs blossomed. And today, the Indian toys market, including wooden toys, is projected to grow from USD 2.40 billion in 2025 to USD 6.95 billion by 2034, exhibiting a 12.5% CAGR.

The appeal of softwood
