

### Fighter plane crashes in Gui. one pilot killed

A Jaguar fighter jet of the Indian Air Force (IAF) crashed during a training mission near Jamnagar Air Force Station on Wednesday night, officials confirmed.

The aircraft went down in an open field at Suvarda village, approximately 12 km from Jamnagar city. Senior police officer stated that while one pilot successfully ejected before the crash, another was found dead by villagers.

## 11 policemen injured in attack while rescuing hostage cops, 12 arrested

In a shocking incident in Sikar, more than 30 police officers were attacked by villagers, and sustained severe injuries, while attempting to rescue their colleagues who had been held hostage.

The police team, consisting of officers from 5 police stations, had arrived in Dalawali Dhani area of Ajitgarh on late Tuesday night to free 3 officers who were captured by the relatives of a suspected criminal. Dur-

The police actively paraded the arrested suspects through the streets of Ajitgarh as part of their investigation process on Wednesday evening. After the parade, police personnel had conducted raids at the scene of the incident.

ing the rescue operation, police were ambushed by the villagers, with stones being thrown from rooftops. Several officers, including CI and SI, were injured in the attack, with some sustaining head injuries. The police vehicles were also damaged, and few police officers were trapped in the confrontation. The situation escalated to such an extent that additional forces were called in, including the RAC, to restore order.

By Wednesday morning, police had arrested over 12 individuals in connection with the attack. However, the main suspect, Mahipal is on the run. Following the incident, the Ajitgarh Police Station was transformed into fortress with a heavy security presence.

# Mob attacks over 30 cops; several injured

A violent clash broke out in the Dalawali Dhani village in Sikar, Rajasthan, on Tuesday night, leading to a significant attack on police officers. The confrontation resulted in at least 11 police personnel sustaining serious injuries, with several of them requiring medical treatment. The incident began when three police officers from Ajitgarh police station went to apprehend Mahipal, an accused in a case of assault.

During a wedding procession in a village, Mahipal's associates allegedly held police officers hostage. As police launched a rescue operation with over 30 personnel from five stations, villagers armed with stones attacked them from rooftops, damaging police vehicles. The situation escalated as the mob surrounded and assaulted officers, taking ASI Nekiram hostage and seizing his phone. Despite negotiation attempts, police were at-



tacked with lathis and stones, leaving several injured. Additional forces, including RAC, were deployed to restore order. By Wednesday morning, 12 people were arrested, but Mahipal remained at large. A local woman from the village accused the police of unnecessary brutality, stating that the officers broke into homes, destroyed property, and physically assaulted family members. She claimed that the police beat family members with sticks, broke uten-

present during the raid. Following the incident, Former Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot expressed concern over the increasing attacks on police personnel, stating that ever since the BJP came to power, the authority of the police has been diminishing. He claimed that criminals have become more emboldened. leading to a rise in attacks on law enforcement officers. Rajasthan PCC Chief Govind Singh Dotasra condemned the attack, calling it a reflection of the BJP government's

### WOMAN ESCAPES ABDUCTION IN SIROHI'S MAROL, **ACCUSED FLEE; POLICE REGISTERS CASE**

Sirohi's Reodar region witnessed a shocking incident as a young woman narrowly escaped an alleged kidnapping attempt. The incident occurred in Marol village, where the victim, a local resident, filed a police complaint against two identified individuals. According to the complaint, a car carrying four men tried to forcibly abduct her. They attempted to drag her into the vehicle with clear intentions of kidnapping. However, the woman's loud cries for help alerted nearby residents, who rushed to her rescue. Seeing the growing crowd, the accused fled the scene in their car. The incident has caused panic in the area, and the Revdar police have registered a case based on the woman's complaint. Authorities have launched an investigation.

On Tuesday, officers from the CBN's Chittorgarh unit successfully intercepted a tractor trolley on the Badawli-Palcha highway, near the Pangad Resort, in the Chittorgarh district. The authorities seized a total of 181.460 kilograms of illegal opium husk (doda chura) packed in nine bags, and arrested one individual in connection with the crime.

This operation was carried out as part of the ongoing anti-drug campaign spearheaded by Naresh Bundel, Dy Narcotics Commissioner in Kota. Following a tipoff, a special team from the Chittorgarh CBN unit was deployed to monitor the route. After identifying the vehicle, officials successfully halted the tractor trolley and recovered the illegal substance.

Jaipur police have cracked down on a gang involved in mobile theft at the SMS Hospital premises. ### JDA's Dravyavati STP construction faces another legal hurdle First India Bureau

The Jaipur Development Authority (JDA) has faced yet another setback regarding the construction of a sewage treatment plant (STP) for the Dravyavati River. JDA had planned to establish the STP near the culvert on Janpath in Shyam Nagar, specifically on Khasra number 309 in the village of Sushilpura. However, the JDA Tribunal has refused to acknowledge JDA's claim over the land.

He stated that the land still belongs to its original owner and that ownership rights had not been revoked. He further explained that merely classifying the land as "Khatedari" does not automatically grant JDA ownership rights.

## **Ensure robust preps to prevent** seasonal diseases: Min Khimsar

Health Min Khimsar puts Rajasthan on alert for heatwave instructs officials

Health Minister Gajendra Singh Khimsar said that, according to the Meteorological Department, extreme heat and heatwave warnings have been issued for several states, including Rajasthan. In view of this, officials in all districts should remain on alert mode and ensure the necessary preparations as soon as possible. There should be no shortcomings in arrangements related to testing, medicines, and treatment at any healthcare facility. Any negligence at any level will lead to disciplinary action against the

responsible officer. The Health Minister was reviewing preparations for the prevention of seasonal diseases and other related matters via video conference during a high-level meeting held at the Health Bhawan on Wednesday. He said that preparations for preventing seasonal diseases should be continuously monitored at state level. Additionally, state-level officials should conduct regular field inspections.



Health Min Gajendra Singh Khimsar during the review meeting of Department of Health in Jaipur on Wednesday, Gayatri Rathore, Ambrish Kumar, Neha Giri, Priyanka Goswami, Dr T Shubhamangala, Dr Ravi Prakash Sharma, and other senior officials were also present.

Similarly, divisional and district-level officials must also inspect their respective areas to ensure healthcare services remain efficient.

Principal Secretary of Health Dept, Gayatri Rathore, said that department is proactively ensuring timely preparations for prevention and treatment of seasonal diseases during upcoming summer. She instructed that wherever there is a shortage of doctors or other staff in healthcare institutions, alternative arrangements should be made immediately, and vacant positions should be filled to avoid disruption in health services. The timely and adequate supply of medicines should be ensured, and officials should regularly monitor the arrangements.

### TIMELY PROCUREMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF **ESSENTIAL RESOURCES**

The Health Minister emphasised that no healthcare institution should report a shortage of fans. coolers, air conditioners, etc. The procurement of essential resources should be ensured in time. If necessary, funds available under RMRS should be used as per regulations. Additionally, support can be sought from donors, voluntary organisations, and philanthropists. Khimsar also instructed that control rooms should be established in districts and operated smoothly. Emergency medical services in all hospitals should be well-equipped, and functionality of ambulances, along with the availability of all life-saving equipment, should be ensured. Public awareness initiatives should also be undertaken to educate people on preventing seasonal diseases.

### **ENSURE ALTERNATIVE ARRANGEMENTS** WHERE THERE IS A STAFF SHORTAGE

Khimsar reviewed the availability of doctors and nursing staff in all districts and instructed that wherever there is an insufficient number of doctors or nursing staff, alternative arrangements should be made. As per regulations, contractual recruitment of doctors or other medical personnel should be done at local level. He directed that a detailed report on human resource availabil ity in healthcare institutions from all districts should be submitted by Thursday afternoon.

### **VACANT POSITIONS IN TRAUMA CENTRES** AND FRUS TO BE FILLED SOON: KHIMSAR

Khimsar reviewed the smooth operation of trauma centers and First Referral Units (FRUs) in all districts. He stressed that trauma centers play a crucial role in saving lives. The state government is ensuring the functionality of these centers by providing the necessary human resources and equipment. Wherever the operation of trauma centers and FRUs is affected due to a lack of personnel or equipment, vacant positions will be filled as soon as possible.

### 'State leads in PM Kisan enrollments, now more focus on revenue reforms'

Revenue Min Hemant Meena announced that Rajasthan has achieved the highest PM Kisan registration in India, with 81% of eligible farmers (7.3 million) registered. He urged officials to aim for 100% registration and ensure efficient handling of land-related cases.



During a review meeting, Hemant Meena directed officials to expedite boundary determination, land division, and land conversion cases while enhancing the e-Dharti portal. He also emphasized resolving revenue cases pending for over ten years and ensuring smooth implementation of Rising Rajasthan MoUs through RajNivesh portal. Principal Secretary Dinesh Kumar stressed door-to-door farmer registration and digital crop surveys. Revenue Board Chairman Hemant Gera highlighted innovations like mandatory daily hearings for old cases and two judicial shifts to improve resolutions.

## Rajasthan HC summons DGP over Police inaction in minor's disappearance case

The Rajasthan High Court has summoned the state's Director General of Police (DGP) over police's inaction in a minor girl's disappearance case. The petitioner had filed a Habeas Corpus petition, citing police negligence despite an FIR being lodged on Feb 5, 2025, at Pratap-

nagar Police Station. On Wednesday, Jaipur East DCP Tejaswini Gautam appeared before the court, but the bench comprising Justice Indrajeet Singh and Justice Mukesh Rajpurohit found her report unsatis-



factory. Expressing strong displeasure, the court noted that despite a month passing, the police had taken no action against the named suspects.

Following this, the court summoned DGP to appear on April 7, 2025, to explain the delays. The petitioner's advocates, Narendra Gurjar and Chandrashekhar Sharma, emphasized that police's failure to act has worsened the complainant's distress, as the minor remains missing and the accused remain unchecked.

### **HEARING ON INTERIM BAIL TO ASARAM REMAINS** INCOMPLETE, NEXT HEARING ON APRIL 7

Jodhpur: The Rajasthan High Court has not granted immediate relief to convicted rapist Asaram in his ongoing case. During a half-hour hearing on Wednesday, the government opposed interim bail, citing his viola tion of Supreme Court conditions by continuing discourses despite a ban. The court has scheduled the next hearing for April 7, 2025, and asked Asaram to file an affidavit addressing the allegations. After surrendering at Jodhpur Central Jail on Tuesday, Asaram was shifted to a private hospital. Though granted interim bail in a Gujarat case, he remains in jail pending rulings in both cases. ### COURT ORDERS SEALING OF DEO OFFICE IN AJMER FOR UNPAID SALARIES OF ₹1.5 CR TO 6 TEACHERS

In Ajmer, the office of the District Education Officer (Primary) was sealed on Wednesday due to non-payment of dues to six teachers. The teachers are owed a total of approximately Rs 1.5 crore in pending payments. Earlier, a court team had visited the officer's chamber and ordered the sealing, but the officer had requested an extension of one month. However, despite passage of six months. the payment has not been made, leading to today's action. The court team took the decision to seal office after the officer failed to fulfill the payment obligations within extended period. The matter has now been brought to forefront as education department faces scrutiny over delay in settling these dues.

### SC raps RSRTC over pending allowances





# 'Narendra Modi's novel water management ideas struck me'

we do, we must take the



ter potable and fit for bathing. Our rivers should have clean water, and towards that motto we should all devote our efforts. The second thing that struck me was the PM's emphasis on performance, i.e. the work that should be visible on the ground. In our system, we put a lot of emphasis on 'construction' but not the same kind of attention towards 'performance'. For instance, we easily build sewage treatment plants, but how well or efficiently they are functioning, and what the lacunae are, if any, that can further enhance their efficiency or performance, doesn't remain our concern. The PM wanted us to shun this habit. He wanted us to work towards achieving our goals in a time bound manner through consistent focus on the performance aspect of any project. There was another thing that I find important to mention, and that is Modi ji's emphasis on public participation. He



stressed involving the members of the public in cleaning the Ganga as well as other rivers. He said, even if we build a sewage plant, or any other such thing with government funding, we can't make it a success if people don't cooperate and be a part of the nation building process. We will keep cleaning on the one hand, and people will keep littering and polluting on the other, and the end result will come to a null. That's why in anything and everything people into confidence and make them a part of the initiatives for their effective implementation. Narendra Modi suggested another important point at the meeting. He stressed the importance of micro irrigation and said, we will have to find out ways as to how more and more farm areas could be successfully irrigated with the minimum amount of water available at our disposal. On former PM Atal Bihari Vajpayee's birth anniversary on December 25, Modi ji launched the Atal Bhujal Yojana, which was to bring about a paradigm shift in water management in the country. I remember, he had told an important thing at the inaugural event at Vigyan Bhawan in Delhi related to micro-irrigation. He had said, our plants needed water, not our farms. In our country, the water use efficiency is very low. Earlier it was thought that only engineering marvels like big dams and irrigation projects could lead to ample water availability for our farms and crops. This new scheme changed the approach. For one, for the first time we had a dedicated funding for water. Second, people from the ground level were empowered to manage their water resources. The concept of participatory irrigation management was introduced for the first time. Now on, the information and authority was not limited to the contractor or the engineer or the administrative officials engaged in fitting pipes or constructing tanks. The villagers knew of their resources, the quality and quantity of water they were to receive, and what actually was happening so that they could act accordingly at their own level, without being dependent on the government or the private agency to do things for them. This led to greater accountability and better management of water in villag-

es. Water budgeting was introduced, so that villagers knew their surplus or deficit and a water security plan was put in place, so that they could devise ways not just to raise water availability in their respective village but also to save water from going to waste. Under the government's Jal Jeevan Mission, Modi ji even interacted from time to time with the village-level committees to see if the plan was working as envisaged and kept guiding and instructing officials and villagers on ways to make it work even more effectively, always intent at removing the roadblocks whatsoever thwarting the process in any way. Today, the portal is in the public domain for all to see what is happening in this field. Every important phone number of the person(s) concerned, right from the state to the block and village level across the country can be accessed and information gathered on the

availability, quality and distribution of water under various heads. It can be located and addressed if anything is posing a hurdle in the ample availability of water to villagers or in the efficient and optimum functioning of the village water management committees. These seminal changes were never even thought of before. But Modi ji brought in all these and paved the way for a secure future of our rivers as well as our people.

Rijiju began with jabs at the Congress, claiming the party had made "questionable" changes to Waqf laws when in power, including the denotification of "123 major buildings... given to the Waqf".

### **WAQF BILL FOCUSES** ON PROPERTY MGMT, **NOT RELIGION: RIJIJU**

Union Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Wednesday tabled the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2025, in the Lok Sabha, which seeks to improve the functioning of Waqf properties, address complexities, ensure transparency and introduce technology-driven management. Rijiju said the legislation has nothing to do with religion, but deals only with properties. "The government is not going to interfere in any religious institution. The changes made in the Waqf law by the UPA government gave it overriding effect over other statutes, hence the new amendments were required," Rijiju said.

### OPPOSITION'S 4D **ATTACK ON CENTRE OVER AMENDMENT BILL**

As the US government's reciprocal tax seems imminent, Indian exporters are in a wait-and-watch mode. While they are concerned, they cannot yet fully assess the sectoral impact. The full extent will only be clear once the tariff is implemented. However, initial estimates suggest that India's farm sector, gems and jewellery, electronics, auto components, and textiles & apparels are likely to be most af-

According to an analysis by the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), Indian farm exports to the US currently face a 5.3% tariff, while US farm exports to India face a much higher 37.7%, creating a tariff differential of 32.4%. Pharmaceuticals face an additional tariff of 10.9%, diamonds and jewellery 13.3%, and electronics 7.2%.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) was at 58.1 in March, up from 56.3 in February, indicating a substantial improvement in the health of the sector that was above its long-run average.

In February, India's manufacturing PMI fell to a 14-month low amid softer increase in new orders and production.

In PMI parlance, a print above 50 means expansion, while a score below 50 denotes contraction.

Manufacturing sector growth in India recovered the ground lost in February, largely driven by a stronger contribution from its largest subcomponent: the New Orders Index.

March saw total sales expand to the greatest extent since July 2024, with companies remarking on positive customer interest, favourable demand conditions and successful marketing initiatives.

Accordingly, firms scaled up production vol-

## Indian Navy Seizes 2,500 kg Narcotics

New Delhi



The operation to seize the narcotics was launched after the Navy received inputs on March 31 on suspicious movements of some vessels, they said.

After systematically interrogating all suspicious vessels in the vicinity, INS Tarkash intercepted and



boarded a suspect dhow, owing to the coordinated efforts with the P8I marine surveillance aircraft and the Maritime Operations Centre in Mumbai, a Navy spokesperson said.

Additionally, the ship launched its integral helicopter to monitor the activities of the suspicious vessel and identify other vessels likely operating in the area, he said.

A specialist boarding team, along with Marine Commandos, boarded the suspect vessel and conducted a thorough search, leading to the discovery of various sealed

packets, the official said. Further search and interrogation revealed over 2,500 kgs of narcotic substances (including 2,386 kgs of hashish and 121 kgs of heroin) stored in different cargo holds and compartments onboard the vessel, he said.

The suspicious dhow was subsequently brought under the control of INS Tarkash, and the crew underwent comprehensive questioning regarding their modus operandi and the presence of other similar vessels in the area, the spokesperson added.






