In a big breakthrough between the Centre and the Opposition in Parliament, MPs of both Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha have agreed to hold a debate on the Constitution to commemorate its 75th year of adoption. The debates will be held on December 13 and 14 in the Lok Sabha, and on December 16 and 17 in the Rajya Sabha.

The end to the Parlia-

mentary stalemate came after Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla chaired an allparty meeting on Monday. PM Narendra Modi to speakoOn Constitution in Both Houses of Parliament on Dec 13 and 14.

"The debate on the Constitution will be held on December 13 and 14 in the Lok Sabha, and 16 and 17 in the Rajya Sabha," Union Minister Kiren Rijiju told reporters outside the Parliament. "It is not good to disrupt parliamentary proceedings. We appeal to all opposition leaders to make good on the agreement that all of us will ensure parliament functions smoothly from tomorrow," Rijiju said.

During the scheduled debates, Trinamool Congress MPs will speak on the ongoing atrocities against minority communities, especially Hindus, in Bangladesh, while the SP will take up the Sambhal violence.



CALGIRI MARG BEING IGNORED AHEAD OF RISING RAJASTHAN SUMMIT

Neglect & apathy of JDA leaves key alternate route in limbo

No asphalt on large section of the road from Rajput Colony turn to Apex Circle

Due to the indifference and negligence of senior engineers at the Jaipur **Development Authority** (JDA), the main alternate route for the Rising Rajasthan Summit is facing severe neglect. If the situation remains unchanged, domestic and international guests attending this grand event will carry not just impressions of the capital but a negative image of the entire state. It is about Calgiri Marg in Malviya Nagar. The primary venue for the Rising Rajasthan Summit is the Jaipur Exhibition and Convention Centre (JECC) located in the Sitapura Industrial Area. There will be pressure on the main routes leading to JECC during the event. The main alternate route leading to JECC, after Tonk Road, starts from the Malviya Nagar Overbridge on JLN Marg, passes through Calgiri Marg, continues to Apex Circle, and further ex-

Sitapura Industrial Area. While Mahal Road, part of this alternate route, is being given significant attention and beautification by JDA, Calgiri Marg remains a victim of gross neglect by the JDA's senior engineers. This oversight is tends via Mahal Road to particularly concerning

given the importance of this route for the grand event. Even though Calgary Road is included as the main alternate route for the grand event of Rising Rajasthan, it remains overlooked by senior engineers of the Jaipur Development Authority (JDA).

With only a few days left for the event, the responsible engineers at JDA have yet to pay attention to this critical route. The First India News team inspected the condition of Calgiri Marg, stretching from the Malviya Nagar Overbridge to Apex Circle.

SEWAGE OVERFLOWING

- A large section of the road from the Rajput Colony turn on Calgiri Marg to Apex Circle is without asphalt.
- Local residents say the situation has been this way since before Diwali.
- A sewage line was laid in this section, but while the line was installed, the road was left in its current condition
- In this section, except for a few parts, the road is mostly dug up with potholes scattered throughout.
- On the other side of the divider in this section, the sewage line has overflowed. As a result, dirty water is spread across entire road.
- The condition of the Peacock Garden, developed by the JDA ten years ago, is also severe.
- The colour of the chhatris built in the garden has completely faded
- The peacocks painted on these fading chhatris are not visible from a distance.

During the inspection, it did not seem like we were travelling on such an essential route, designated as the main alternate pathway for a megaevent like Rising Rajasthan, which aims to attract investments worth several lakh crores to the

Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma directed officials to set targets and work accordingly during the review meeting of the Mining and Petroleum Department at the Chief Minister's office on Monday. He emphasized that mineral resources provided by nature should be used for public welfare with transparency throughout the process. Sharma emphasised Rajasthan's achievement of auctioning 47 major mineral blocks in the first year, surpassing the previous government's fiveyear total of 34. Additionally, 426 non-major mineral plots were auctioned, exceeding the previous government's 282. He directed officials to ensure compliance, curb illegal mining, and conduct regular mining lease auctions. Sharma also reported a significant rise in mining royalties for both major and non-major minerals.

Authority vs Accountability in Indian context

ership is often spoken c u s s e d around in workplaces, politics, and even self-help circles. The essential question, though, is what is leadership exactly? Is it about giving orders or building consensus? In simple words, leadership is about taking risks and challenging the status quo. Leaders motivate others to achieve something new and better. Interestingly, leaders pursue innovations willingly and not as an obligation or burden. This is what makes them bring the best in people. Political leadership is instrumental for social change. Overcoming social problems or modernising and abolishing social norms has been impossible without the right kind of leadership. Leaders work for goodness of society, respect their people's voice, create a positive and happy society, and keep these people motivated and inspired. Leadership will emphasise the importance of education, picking the right career, working hard and focusing on performance. Effective political leadership requires a strong character and the leaders must exhibit honesty, integrity, trustworthiness, accountability and ethics. A political leader may

have the authority, title or position but will only emerge as true leader if possesses several qualities like ability to motivate individuals, dedicated, willing to listen, trustworthy, competent, accountable, decisive, selfless, good communicator, and is a visionary with full understanding of the goals of the team or organisation. An effective leader has to maintain balance between desire for results and concern for his people. A true leader generally leads by example, shows path; delegates' tasks based on others skills and not just merely direct people from a position of authority. In India, most of the current political leaders lack the basic and important leadership qualities such as accountability, transparency, accessibility and integrity. Some of the leaders are even booked for corruption and other illegal activities. In the present generation the word political leaders

opinion on the citizens unlike past political leaders. However, some of the upcoming young leaders are following the leadership ideals and we see some welcoming positive changes in Indian politics.

When Indian leaders first took control of their government in 1947, they proclaimed the ideals of national unity and secular democracy. Through the first half century of nationbuilding, leaders could point to uneven but measurable progress on key goals. But there has been a noticeable decline in quality of governance and today, despite best efforts by government, we are seeing mass unemployment or under employment creating a state of despair. The public necessities like health, education, housing, air and water, need a major revamp to meet the basic needs of people. India aspires to be a great power, and this will be decided by the character of leadership that rises to the highest elected offices in the country today. The deteriorating profile of elected representatives in the country gives little hope, unless an honest, intellect, and motivated, leadership with accountability emerges to re-

alise, restore glory of India. Moral responsibility and accountability have steadily eroded in Indian politics. Where earlier leaders resigned for moral reasons even when they were not directly at fault, today our political class often avoids such actions, opting to deflect blame instead. This decline in accountability represents a broader shift from the ethical standards that once guided the leaders of the country as seen in train accident in Odisha 2023 vs Mahbubnagar, Andhra Pradesh in 1956 where the then Railway Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri resigned taking moral dent. Similarly, resignations of TT Krishnamachari, the finance minister and K. Krishna Menon defence minister on moral grounds were all examples of moral responsibility and accountability at its Zenith which in subsequent decades has diluted heading to Nadir. Accountability is not just

a political buzzword; it is a cornerstone of democratic governance. Political philosophers like John Stuart Mill and Jean-Jacques Rousseau have long argued that a leader's primary responsibility in a democracy is to serve the people, with power being a trust placed in the hands of those elected. If leaders evade accountability, this trust is broken, and democracy becomes hollow. In the Indian context, Mahatma Gandhi was embodiment of moral accountability. He drew this from the principles of ancient Indian philosophy, where kings were seen as custodians of the welfare of the people and were bound by dharma. The erosion of accountability in Indian politics has far-reaching implications. When leaders avoid responsibility, public trust in political system diminishes. Democracy thrives when its leaders are willing to stand accountable for their actions, policies, decisions. Without accountability, very foundation of democratic governance weakens, thereby making citizens left to rely on the oncein-every-five-year elections to undo their mistakes.

What's ideal, two or threechild policy in India?

These contrasting approaches reflect India's lack of a cohesive population policy, which is essential for balancing demographic needs with socio-economic realities.

India's demographic diversity poses unique challenges. States in the north still grapple with high fertility rates, while southern states face the threat of an ageing population and workforce shortages. A uniform policy must accommodate these regional disparities while addressing national concerns like gender equity, education, and healthcare keeping the delimitation exercise in mind.

Rather than arbitrary quotas, the focus should shift to empowering families through education and access to contraception. A balanced, inclusive policy can ensure population stability while fostering economic growth and regional harmony.

TRUMP'S IMPRACTICAL THREAT TO BRICS



ormer US President Donald Trump's impractical warning of high tariffs to BRICS against their attempt to introduce an alternative currency to challenge the U.S. dollar highlights the rising geopolitical tensions in the global financial system. Trump, a staunch advocate of American dominance, called the move a threat to the U.S. economy and global stability. While BRICS' ambition to diversify from dollar dependence is not new, the group's growing assertiveness reflects a shift towards a multipolar economic order.

The implications of a BRICS-backed alternative cur-

rency are significant. A reduced reliance on the dollar could diminish America's ability to impose financial sanctions and erode the influence of its monetary policy on global markets. For the BRICS grouping, particularly China and Russia, this represents an opportunity to challenge the dollar's hegemony. However, the feasibility of such a currency remains uncertain due to economic disparities and diverging political interests within the bloc.

For India, which has adopted a cautious approach to de-dollarisation, the implications are nuanced. While a multipolar currency framework aligns with New Delhi's strategic autonomy, an overt shift away from the dollar could strain its relations with the U.S., a key economic and geopolitical partner. Moreover, India's trade dynamics, largely dollar-dependent, may face disruptions in the short term. At the same time, engaging in a global currency alternative could enhance India's role in shaping the evolving financial architecture.

The dollar's dominance will not wane overnight, but BRICS' efforts mark a growing challenge to U.S.-led financial structures. For India, navigating this transformation will require a delicate balance between strategic partnerships and the pursuit of economic sovereignty.

"Hon'ble Members, you are all undoubtedly cognizant of Murphy's Law," Dhankhar said, highlighting the repeated failure to carry out legislative work. "It appears there exists a deliberate algorithm to actualize Murphy's Law in this August House, consequently impeding the proper func-

tioning of Parliament." The Chairman's comments came as a response responsibility, urging

(nuclear-powered attack submarines) indicated its "faith" in the country's indigenous capabilities to build such boats.

Fast attack submarines are used to target enemy ships and submarines and may launch cruise missiles against land and sea targets. These are different from SSBMs such as the INS Arighaat, which have a primary role of launching nuclear-tipped ballistic missiles.



The investigation found records of Rs 240 crore in cash transactions at Udaipur office and Rs29 crore in cash transactions at the Mumbai office, both of which are under suspicion. The investigation revealed misuse of GST reverse charge benefits and unreported income linked to luxury vehicles, including BMW, Volvo, and Porsche.





