India creates history by winning 2 awards at Oscars 2023; Song 'Naatu Naatu' from film RRR wins 'Best Original Song' award, becoming the first ever Indian song to win in the category. 'The Elephant Whisperers' bags award for the 'Best Documentary Short Film'

Academy Awards 2023 was held at the Dolby Theatre in Los Angeles on Sunday. 'Naatu Naatu' from SS Rajamouli's RRR has won the

Oscar in the Best Song category by beating the other nominees in the category which included Applause (Tell It Like a Woman), Hold My Hand (Top Gun Maverick), Lift Me Up (Black Pather Wakanda Forever), and This is a Life (Everything Everywhere All at Once). With this, the film became the first song from any Indian production to win the award. It is the second Indian song to win this prestigious award, after Jai Ho from Slumdog Millionaire won one in 2009 in the same category.

Another Indian entry in the Academy Awards 'The Elephant Whisperers' also won an Oscar in the Best Documentary Short Film category. This 41 minutes short documentary movie of filmmaker Kartiki Gonsalves and producer Guneet Monga, explores the bond between Raghu, an orphaned baby elephant, and his caretakers.

The Naatu Naatu craze has been taking over the Oscars this year. At the very start of the ceremony, the audience saw a spoof performance when Jimmy Kimmel was driven off stage by dancers performing the Naatu Naatu hookstep.

At the Dolby Theatre on Sunday, the audience also witnessed an energetic performance of the song. The performance also received a standing ovation from the audience. RRR garnered several US awards, made it to the BAFTA 2023 longlist in the Film Not in the English Language category, won the Golden Globes in the Best Original Song category, and also bagged the Best Song at the 28th edition of the Critics Choice Awards, along with Best Foreign Language Film, among others.

It is the first time that 3 India-made productions earned Oscar nominations and we brought home 2 awards with huge pride!

# 'EVERYTHING, EVERYWHERE, ALL AT ONCE' SWEEPS OFF AWARDS



he Academy Awards in 2023 were a less scandalous affair than last year - although host Jimmy Kimmel never let us forget "the slap", with so many jokes it was verging on a deadhorse-beating situation.

In fact it was a relatively wholesome ceremony, defined by great sweeps for films All Quiet On The Western Front and Everything Everywhere All At Once. Perhaps the only "shock" was Angela Bassett losing Best Supporting Actress to Jamie Lee Curtis, and thereby being denied the chance to "do the thing".

Here, we summarise the most important moments from the 2023 Oscars.

**ALL THE LOOKS OF** THE CHAMPAGNE The Oscars 2023 red-

The fundamental changes have made MBS an unpopular leader among followers of Islam. That he has overseen a crackdown on prominent clerics also has been decried. As the monarch envisions a modern and reformed Saudi Arabia, changes are aimed at restructuring religion in a highly religious, Wahaabi society. The changes do not seem irreversible but are cause of disquiet because the country was once known for its tough religious police and a sharia-trained judiciary. The changes have been possible because MBS may not be unreasonably committed to Wahabi teachings.

Elephant Whisperers, which bagged an Oscar in Best Documentary Short Film category, also made country proud. # Council adjourned briefly over suspension demand

Mumbai: After an uproar by Opposition bench legislators, the Maharashtra Legislative Council was adiourned for 20 minutes on Monday morning.

The MLCs demanded suspension of a Cooperation Department official facing corruption charges, but state minister Atul Save rejected

the demand citing an ongoing inquiry.

After the Council reassembled after 20 minutes at around 11.50 am, the minister announced that the official is being sent on compulsory leave.

The issue was raised by Shiy Sena - Uddhay Balasaheb Thackeray legislator Narendra Darade alleging that an assistant registrar was allegedly converting a cooperative industrial society into a housing society.

Supporting him, Congress MLC Bhai Jagtap said, "The state government should suspend the concerned official immediately and complete the inquiry against him. (The official) Ashish Deshpande

# Mumbai sizzles at 39.4°C

City records highest temp in country for the second time in March; delayed or absent sea breeze to blame, says IMD

Mumbai: For the second time this month, Mumbai recorded the highest maximum temperature in the country at 39.4 degrees Celsius on Sunday, said the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

The weather authority attributed the rise in mercury to absent or delayed sea breeze.

Notably, the IMD had warned of a heatwave on Sunday and Monday.

The Santacruz observatory (located in suburbs) and the Colaba observatory (located at the southern tip of iscity)—around 19km apart—recorded temperatures of 39.4 degrees Celsius and 35.8 degrees Celsius, respectively, on Sunday.

"This is for the second time this month that Mumbai has recorded the highest maximum temperature in the country. On March 06, Santacruz (observatory) recorded 39.1 degrees Celsius, also the highest in the country (that day). On Sunday, the city recorded 39.4 degrees Celsius," said IMD scientist Rajendra Jenamani.

According to the IMD, the highest Mumbai temperature in March was 41.3 degrees Celsius recorded at the

Santacruz observatory on March 17, 2011. Seven years later, the metropolis (Santacruz observatory) had recorded 41 degrees Celsius on March 26, 2018.

The IMD scientist said the temperature recorded in the coastal Konkan region, which encompasses Mumbai, was four to six degrees Celsius above normal on March 12.

This was also observed between March 05 and 07 when the temperature was five to seven degrees above normal, Jenamani added.

The commission had initiated proceedings on the issue of non-renewal of the lease of the Mumbai Racecourse land.

The racecourse was given to the Royal Western India Turf Club (RWITC) in May 1994 on a lease.

Mumbai: A Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) officer at the Mumbai Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport foiled a bid to smuggle foreign currency by intercepting the suspect passengers, leading to the seizure of Rs1.55 crore concealed in their hand baggage. CISF staff at integrated security held three members of a Mumbai family, a man, his wife and his sister-in-law, who were travelling to Bangkok on Saturday night with baggage that consisted of bulky wedding gifts. "A detailed physical examination after X-ray screening led to the recovery of US\$1.90 lakh concealed in the hand baggage of the family of three Indian passengers," confirmed a senior CISF officer.

#### **MAJOR FIRE IN MUMBAI SLUMS**; **NOBODY HURT**

Mumbai: A major fire broke out in slums in suburban Malad on Monday afternoon, but no casualty was reported, a Fire Brigade official said. The level 3 (major) fire engulfed slums located in the Appa Pada locality and efforts were on to douse the flames, he said. Smoke billowing out of the area could be seen from several kilometres away. According to the official, fire tenders, jumbo water tankers and other equipment were engaged in controlling the blaze. An ambulance has been also stationed at the site. (33.8%) said they could talk about their caste only among "very close" friends, while only 27 students (7.2%) felt unafraid to discuss caste in their "extended friends" circles.

The term "very close friend" implies someone from the respondents' own social background. Effectively, this indicates that almost 245 (63.2%) of respondents were not comfortable talking about caste



# Retail inflation dips marginally to 6.44%

retail inflation declined marginally to 6.44% yearon-year in February as against 6.52% in January, data released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation showed on Monday.

The sequential inflation declined by 0.17%. The inflation rate has remained above the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) tolerance band of 2-6% for the second straight month.

The high inflation level can be attributed to rising food prices, which account for nearly 40% of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) basket. Food inflation came in at 5.95% in February.

Inflation rate for vegetables contracted marginally by 11.6% against a contraction of 11.7% in the previous month. Meanwhile, inflation rate for fuel and light declined to 9.90%

of January. "February CPI inflation

from 10.84% in the month

at 6.44% while elevated is broadly in line with expectations. Cereals and milk inflation continues to be high while fruits inflation spiked up too in February. Core inflation at 6.1% remains elevated and sticky with relatively high inflation across clothing and care and effects, and household goods/services. The RBI will remain hawkish in the April policy as inflation prints have spiked back over 6 per cent in January-February along with core inflation remaining sticky above 6 per cent. We continue to expect a 25 bps repo rate hike in the April policy," said Suvodeep Rakshit, Senior Economist, Kotak Institutional Equities.

Higher inflation has been a concern for central banks across the world, including India, as the uncertain nature of the Russia-Ukraine war compounded supply-side disruptions in the post-pandemic world.



"In fact, a Rs. 10,000 crore scheme has been announced to provide interest-free loans to the Dhangar community. Some people think, how is this possible? But we have been working on it for the past few months. The state government can borrow through the National Cooperative Corporation (NCDC). In this regard, our minis-Radhakrishna Vikhe-Patil and I both met Amit Shah," added Fadnavis.

### Maha Cong holds protest on Adani, submit memo to Guv

Mumbai: Maharashtra Congress on Monday held a protest in Mumbai and shouted slogans against PM Narendra Modi and industrialist Gautam Adani.

The rally started at Girgaon and ended at Raj Bhavan, with state unit chief Nana Patole, former chief ministers Prithviraj Chavan and Ashok Chavan in attendance.

A delegation later submitted a memoran-Governor dum to Ramesh Bais.

"When Adani was looting the money of SBI and LIC, what was our 'chowkidar' doing? It is highly unfortunate the demand of Congress leader Rahul Gandhi to conduct a probe into allegations against the Adani group has been expunged from official records (in Parliament)," Patole alleged.

The term 'chowkidar' (watchman) was at the centre of a Bharatiya Janata Party

general elections to highlight's Modi's zero tolerance towards corruption and wrongdoings.

"There is a fear that investments made by LIC and SBI in Adani firms may be lost. Those who try to raise their voice against the Centre are facing legal action and jail. If the Modi government continues in this manner, democracy will end soon in India," Patole claimed.

Those who join the BJP under pressure (of probe agencies) do not face legal action from thereon, Patole added.

The group has denied all Hindenburg allegations, calling them "malicious", "baseless" and a "calculated attack on India".

Incidentally, the Lok Sabha was informed on Monday that the government has not set up any committee to probe these allegations, but stock market regulator SEBI was investigating market allegations against the Adani group.

# HC dismisses Al union's plea against eviction

High Court on Monday dismissed petitions filed by three Air India Employees' Unions challenging the airline's decision to evict them from the staff quarters at suburban Kalina noting accommodation is not provided as a matter of right and was not a term of employment. A division



bench also said monetization of lands and properties of Air India Limited was one of the essential terms of the airline's disinvestment process.

The court said if em-

ployees continue to hold on to flats then Air India Asset Holding Company would not be able to monetize the land to reduce the burden of Air India's debt.

The bench, however. stayed its order for two weeks to let the unions appeal in the Supreme Court.

"It is not that every employee is granted accommodation as a matter of right," HC said.

Kadam had made Sathe make an application to convert the land usage from agricultural to non-agricultural.

"Kadam had pressurised revenue department officials and obtained illegal permission on September 12, 2017," the ED said.

Apart from this, ED

claimed "Kadam, in connivance with Parab, had caused detrimental damage to the environment by constructing Sai Resort".

The absence of any sewage and other municipal or such outlets for the safe discharge of effluents, owing to the illegal construction of the said resort, was causing great damage to the environment and ecology of the seashore, the ED has claimed.


