The Ministry of External Affairs voiced serious concerns on Tuesday over the arrest of Hindu community leader Chinmoy Krishna Das Brahmachari in Bangladesh. "We have noted with deep concern the arrest and denial of bail to Shri Chinmoy Krishna Das, who is also the spokes-

person of the Bangladesh Sammilit Sanatan Jagran Jote. This incident follows the multiple attacks on Hindus and other minorities by extremist elements in Bangladesh," MEA said. Meanwhile, Government of Bangladesh said that the arrest of Priest Krishna Das Prabhu has been "misconstrued", adding that the seer had been arrested on specific charges.

The proposed power storage system, which will be implemented with the assistance of the Centre, will be set up in four locations in Rajasthan under the Build-Own-Operate (BOO) model.

Additional chief secretary -Energy Alok said that approval for 1,000 MW of storage capacity under the VGF scheme has been given and a proposal for an additional 1,000 MW is still under consideration.

#### 1,000 MW ENERGY STORAGE APPROVED. MORE IN PIPELINE

ACS -Energy Alok said that approval for 1,000 MW of storage capacity under the VGF scheme has been given. "It is difficult to meet peak demand without storage for solar energy. Efforts are underway across the country to address this. While we have received approval for 1,000 MW under VGF, we are offering a bid for 2,000 MW." The estimated project cost is currently estimated at Rs 1 cr per MW, with the Centre providing a grant of Rs 27 lakh per MW.

### ACB nabs Patwari, two more in three traps

The (ACB) Special Unit in Kota arrested Rocky Arora, a Patwari from the Urban Improvement Trust, for accepting a bribe of Rs 3,000. The arrest followed a complaint from a local resident, alleging Arora demanded Rs 18k to approve a lease file. A trap operation, led by ACB officials, caught Arora red-handed while accepting the bribe. Prior to the incident, Arora had already collected Rs 15k from the complainant. An investigation is ongoing under the guidance of ACB senior officials.

In another incident, acting on directives from the ACB Headquarters, the Ajmer unit of the (ACB) arrested Nandlal Choudhary, Meter Reader Grade-II. #### 2 SMUGGLERS ARRESTED WITH PISTOL, LIVE CARTRIDGES, & STOLEN SUV IN PHALODI

Phalodi: Phalodi and Chakhu police have arrested two smugglers with a pistol, five live cartridges and Rs 14 lakh 26,000 during a blockade. Action was taken under the direction of SP Pooja Awana and an SUV going from Bikaner to Jodhpur was stopped. The vehicle was checked and smugglers Kamal Kishore and Rameshwar were detained. Upon checking the vehicle, it was found to be a stolen one. The smugglers were going to buy poppy husk for supply in Phalodi and other rural areas. Police are interrogating the smugglers.

#### 31 HELD IN ILLEGAL GAMBLING RAID IN KISHANGARH, HIGH-PROFILE LINKS SUSPECTED

Ajmer: In a late-night operation, the Gandhinagar Police, under the leadership of IG Ajmer, raided the "Desi Tadka" hotel in Kishangarh, dismantling an illegal gambling network. The hotel, located along the highway, served as the base for the activity. Authorities arrested 31 individuals and confiscated Rs14 lakh in cash during the operation. Among the detainees is reportedly the husband of a municipal corporation councillor, raising questions about potential political links to the illegal activities. Investigations are ongoing as police work to uncover the full scope of the gambling ring. Further details are expected to be disclosed soon.

### JDA issues notices for Sirsi road widening

The Jaipur Development Authority (JDA) is set to begin identifying the constructions falling within the road limits of Sirsi Road and issuing notices to the concerned individuals. This work will commence from Wednesday as per the orders of the Rajasthan High Court. The High Court has given two months time to JDA and the next date in the high

court is January 20, 2025. As per the master plan, the road is to be widened from Queens Road to Khatipura Tiraha to 100 feet, and from Khatipura Tiraha to the Bypass to 160 feet. Currently, the road width from Queens



Road to Khatipura Tiraha is around 70-80 feet, and from Khatipura Tiraha to the Bypass, it is 100-120 feet. There are 274 plots and shops within the road limits, and these constructions need to be removed in order to widen the road.

Meanwhile, traders on Sirsi Road have united against the JDA's road widening project. A meeting of the traders saw the participation of MLA Gopal Sharma, who assured his full support to their cause.

### SGST's enforcement wing takes major action, exposes fraudulent firm

The State Goods and Services Tax (SGST) Department, along with the Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST) Department, has become increasingly against those misusing the GST laws. On Tuesday, the SGST Enforcement Wing carried out a major operation, exposing a racket involving fake firms, and arrested the alleged mastermind Amit Singhal.

According to reliable sources, Amit Singhal, a Chartered Accountant by profession, is accused of creating numerous fake firms under dummy names. He is accused of manipulating approximately Rs 16 crore worth of Input Tax Credit. This action was taken under the direction of Prakash Raj Purohit, the Chief Commissioner of SGST, and led by Deputy Commissioner Mahipal Singh. The investigation has revealed that the accused controlled the bank ac-



The investigation has revealed that the accused controlled the bank accounts used for the transactions of these fake firms.

counts used for the transactions of these fake firms. It was also discovered that after transferring Input Tax Credit to these fake firms through bogus invoices, Singhal would provide this credit to registered GST traders for a commission.

The officials are currently investigating, and it is expected that the amount of input tax credit manipulation could rise beyond Rs 16 crore.

Four paramilitary personnel and two policemen have been killed and over 100 security personnel injured as the protest by supporters of jailed former prime minister Imran Khan turned violent prompting the federal government to deploy the army in the national capital along with shoot at sight orders on Tuesday, state-run media said.

Pakistan deployed the army amid a tense standoff with Khan's supporters from his Pakistan Tehreeke-Insaf (PTI) pushing forward by removing hurdles on their way to Islamabad's D-Chowk venue as the government vowed to foil their attempt "even if a curfew needs to be imposed."



fter delivering a remarkable performance on the political front, it is now time for Chief Minister Bhajan Lal Sharma to focus on streamlining the administration. In the year since assuming office, CM Sharma has gained a deep understanding of the state's bureaucracy. Given his adeptness in political management, it is widely anticipated that he will bring the same level of efficiency and skill to administrative reforms.

The focus at present is on reshuffling the state's IAS officers. Sources suggest that a transfer list of 20-24 IAS officers is under preparation. However, ex-

changes are required at the senior levels. While the Finance department may remain unaffected, many other postings across departments remain improperly allocated. Despite several transfer lists, officer placements are far from satisfactory, with some junior or under-performing officers holding crucial roles while more competent, result-oriented individuals being sidelined.

With the Chief Minister now having adequate time and crucial insights into the functioning of the state administration, it is

### Minister of Maharashtra? What updates do you have on this?

The latest update is that

Devendra Fadnavis is most likely to take over as Chief Minister. This has been agreed upon within the BJP leadership, and it is a consensus choice supported by Narendra Modi, Mohan Bhagwat, Amit Shah, and JP Nadda. The party has made its decision, but now the question is about getting the approval of the other coalition partners, particularly Shinde. Ajit Pawar has already expressed support, but Shinde's consent is still needed. The consultation process is ongoing, and it was expected that all the leaders would meet in Delhi on Monday. However, Shinde didn't come to Delhi as expected, and his temperament is a bit different. Fadnavis was in Delhi for a wedding, and he attended as a star campaigner, with people gathering around him for autographs.

The general consensus in Maharashtra is that Fadnavis will be the next Chief Minister. Credit should be given to the party leadership for honouring the public mandate and making the decision to have Fadnavis as the Chief Minister. Fadnavis's name is the BJP's every month. I heard that clear choice, although

there have been some speculative reports about a potential power-sharing arrangement between Fadnavis and Shinde for two and a half years each. Currently, Shinde and Ajit Pawar are expected to be Deputy Chief Mincabinet positions for all the coalition partners as
