## Modi ji did what no leader had thought in 56 years

was privileged to be India's ambassador and permanent representative to the United Nations in Geneva when PM Narendra Modi ji (then CM of Gujarat) visited Geneva in 2003 to honor the last wish of the great patriot Shyamji Krishna Varma and bring his ashes home to India, 56 years after independence. No other leader in independent India had thought of doing this. PM Narendra Modi ji not only brought the ashes back but also laid them to rest in Shyamji's birthplace, Mandvi (Gujarat), and created a befitting memorial.

In July-August 2003, I received a phone call from him. He said, "I was intending to visit London during your posting. I am on my way to London now, but



while returning, I will also visit Geneva." I was aware of Shyamji and that his ashes, along with his wife's, were kept in the Geneva cemetery. I had just come from London to Geneva in my new posting and remained there until the beginning of 2006. So, I had the privilege of hosting Modi ji. I was also honored to host the function at the Geneva cemetery to bring back the ashes of the great freedom fighter to India. The urns were handed over to CM Modi, and he brought them back to Gujarat. The rest is history, as they say.

An imposing memorial was established over a large area. Here was a man who had dedicated his entire life to the cause of the nation, who had espoused the cause of India's freedom until the end. He had entered into an agreement with the Swiss government to keep his and his wife's ashes in their cemetery in case India didn't win freedom, or until it did, and to transfer them back to India only when the country achieved independence. It is surprising, as well as shocking, that so many leaders

went to Geneva for years, but no one thought of doing what Modi ji did. He became a catalyst in fulfilling the dream of this freedom fighter. It is a truly fascinating story.

This is just one episode in the long experience of public service of our honorable Prime Minister, with which I

had the fortunate chance to be associated. But the real credit goes to him for how he drew from his experience and used it for a noble cause to accomplish tough task that required commitment, awareness, honesty,

and sagacity.

## Approval process for officials' personal foreign trips eased

Under the updated policy, officials no longer need special permission for personal trips, a change that has been positively received across the bureaucracy. The ACS to the CM, Shikhar

CM Bhajan Lal Sharma has been granted permission by court to travel to United Kingdom, from October 13 to 25. 

"The govt has approved the continuation of the universal supply of fortified Rice under all schemes of the Government, including Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana & other welfare schemes etc in its present form, from July 2024 and up to December 2028," as per statement.

ecently, in Pune, the mother of a 26-yearold Chartered Accountant (CA) who tragically passed away blamed the workload at her workplace for her daughter's death in a letter to the authorities. This letter has brought to the public's attention the growing issue of stress-related problems in the workplace, highlight-

ing an emerging health crisis. As we work towards realizing the dream of a developed India, the rising cases of student suicides, surpassing even those of farmers, are a cause for serious concern. In this suffocating merit-driven world, where the focus is on academic excellence, there seems to be little emphasis on equipping children with the skills to deal with everyday challenges. The competition in competitive exams has become increasingly tough for students. The rising number of candidates for any competitive exam makes each exam harder than the last. The trend of measuring a student's talent solely by their grades is further worsening this situation.

The results of these exams have become a race where parents see their dreams coming true through their children's success. In the race to stay ahead in this game of grades, some children are getting injured—though the injury itself is not as painful as the neglect that follows. These circumstances point to the increasing mental health problems among children. In Kota alone, where students prepare for competitive exams, an average of three students committed suicide every month in 2023. The rise in these numbers is not only unfortunate but also points to



a growing disregard for mental health problems.

According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), nearly 13,000 students died by suicide in India in 2021. Maharashtra recorded the highest number of suicides, with 1,834 deaths. The situation is similarly alarming in Rajasthan, with numbers continuing to rise. However, blaming coaching institutes alone for these rising suicide rates is

not enough to control the situation. To truly address the issue, there is a need to change how we view mental health problems. A common misconception about mental health is that children cannot suffer from mental health issues, which is simply untrue. In fact, mental health problems can affect anyone at any age, though they are generally less common in children than

tal health issues, their interest in academic and extracurricular activities tends to wane. The growing addiction to online gaming, substance abuse, and related juvenile crimes are indicators of the severity of the problem.

During childhood and adolescence, significant changes occur in various domains such as physical, emotional, moral, and social. As children navigate through these transitions, some may experience stress, which can lead to mental health issues. Comparative studies by mental health services and the World Health Organization (WHO) indicate that Indian students are more stressed than ever before. Mental health problems among children are on the rise.

According to a 2022 report by

in adults. When children face men- the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), 12 to 14 per cent of Indian students aged 4 to 16 suffer from mental health problems. Studies by the Indian Psychiatric Society and data from the Ministry

of Human Resource Development show that the number of mental health patients has increased by 15 to 20 per cent since the onset of the COV-ID-19 pandemic, with students being no exception.

School Mental Health (SMH) programs can play a significant role in keeping school children mentally healthy. The WHO has recommended the essential implementation of SMH in schools. There is a growing emphasis on the need for SMH programs in India. For instance, the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) has

> stressed the need to reduce stress among students and promote a positive attitude through school programs. However, much

> > more effort is re-

quired in this area. The CBSE suggests that all secondary and senior secondary schools should appoint a counsellor to help improve students' confidence, resilience, and learning ability. In line with "Atmanirbhar Bharat"

(Self-Reliant India) initiative, the Ministry of Education launched "Manodarpan" on 21st July 2020 to promote the mental well-being of teachers, students, and parents. CBSE has also started incorporating life-skills training into its curriculum, which helps boost learners' confidence and perseverance in facing life's challenges.

It is crucial to keep students mentally healthy because this group is a key indicator of the country's health economy. Poor mental health among students affects not only families and society but also the overall development of the nation. Therefore, the increasing prevalence of adolescent mental health problems underscores the need for SMH programs. Policies need to be developed and implemented to improve the mental health of the student population.

We need to assure both children and parents that there are many avenues to success beyond medical, engineering, and administrative services. We must tell our children that if the tenth-grade marksheet was a life determinant, India would never have had Sachin Tendulkar, who helped secure India's place at the top of the world cricket rankings.

Parents must understand that while it is great if their child scores high, it is equally important not to rob them of their confidence and self-esteem if they don't. If the child doesn't score well, you must reassure them that it's just a small test, and they are destined for much bigger things in life. Let them know that you still love them and will not judge them based on their marks. Please, for the love of God, do this, and then watch your child conquer the world.


