

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday laid down his vision for India's semiconductor industry, saying that it is his dream that every device in the world should have a 'Made in India' chip. In a keynote address after inaugurating the Semicon India summit at India Expo Mart in Greater Noida, PM highlighted India's contributions to global semiconductor design ecosystem and said, "In the world of designing, India contributes 20% of the talent. We are preparing semiconductor workforce of 85,000 technicians, engineers, and R&D specialists." PM further emphasized India's strengths, saying, "You have a 3-dimensional power—1st, reform-oriented govt of today; 2nd, India's growing manufacturing base; and 3rd, India's aspirational market. Today, India is major consumer of chips. On this very chip, we have built world's best digital public infrastructure. The Indian

#### BIG DECISION OF MODI 3.0: AYUSHMAN BHARAT TO NOW COVER 70 YEARS+

The Union Cabinet on Wednesday gave its nod to several significant schemes to advance healthcare, renewable energy, and promote electric vehicles to further combat pollution. Most importantly Cabinet approved, Ayushman Bharat PM-JAY scheme with a budget of ₹3,437 crore, aims to provide universal health coverage for senior citizens aged 70 and above, benefiting a total of 4.5 crore families and 6 crore senior citizens, Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said. As per the scheme, for families already covered under the scheme, an additional top-up of up to Rs 5 lakh per year is available, while those not previously covered will receive ₹5 lakh per year in shared coverage.

# Raj shaken by earthquake of 5.8 magnitude in Pakistan

Tremors were felt across Rajasthan after the strong earthquake of 5.8 magnitude struck Pakistan on Wednesday afternoon.

Effect of this earthguake was felt in the border districts of Rajasthan including Ganganagar, Hanumangarh, Bikaner and Jaisalmer where people came out of their homes and offices after feeling mild tremors.

According to the Meteorological Department, the earthquake occurred near the Vehova province of Pakistan at 12.58 pm IST. According to the National Center for Seismology, its magnitude was recorded 5.8 on the Richter scale. The depth of the epicenter of the earthquake was about 33 km below the ground.

In Rajasthan, tremors shook the areas of Sri Ganganagar and Bikaner. Whereas, very mild tremors of earthquake were felt in some rural areas of Jaisalmer, Hanumangarh and Churu. Mild tremors were felt for 4-5 seconds in border districts of Sri Ganganagar.

## Three of a family killed as soil caves in while digging a water-tank

Three members of the same family died tragically due to soil collapse in Danta Ramgarh, Sikar. All the three victims buried in the soil were pulled out with the help of the villagers.

Sarpanch representative Shravan Kumar reported that Kishan Singh (40) from Rajanpura village, along with his nephew Rahul (16) and Vicky alias Vikas (15), died after being buried under soil. The incident occurred during excavation work for constructing a water tank (hod) at a house in the field of Ishwar Burdak in the village. Suddenly The victims, including two children, were pulled out by villagers but were pronounced dead upon arrival at the CHC, Danta

the soil collapsed and all the three including two children standing on the shore got buried under the soil. The matter is of Mei Rajanpura Gram Panchayat of Danta Ramgarh

The excavation was being carried out by Kishan Singh and his elder brother. The victims were sent to CHC, Danta with the help of 108 ambulance where doctors declared all three dead.

Food Dept's Inspection uncovers unsanitary conditions & unsafe practices at Chomu's Vijayvargiya Sweets on Wednesday.

On Wednesday, under "Shuddh Aahar Milawat Par Var" campaign directed by the Chief Minister, an inspection led by Food Safety Commissioner Iqbal Khan and Additional Commissioner Pankaj Ojha uncovered major irregularities at Vijayvargiya Sweets in Chomu. The inspection revealed unsanitary conditions, including uncovered food materials, the use of artificial colors, and unclean facilities. The factory had blackened walls, uncovered dirty drains, and filthy frying equipment. Stale oil and rodent activity were noted, and samples of sweets and artificial colors were seized. Vijayvargiya Sweets has been issued a notice, and further action will follow based on lab results.

Raj HC sets aside APO order for a doc; says CM's permission needed

The High Court has set aside the state government's order to remove Dr. Mahesh Kumar Pawar from the post of the orthopedics department at the JLN District hospital. Pawar was removed and put under Awaiting Posting Orders (APO) status by the state government, which was challenged by him in the high court. The single-judge bench Justice Vinit Kumar Mathur ruled that APO orders for personnel must receive prior approval from the Chief Minister in essential cases. The High Court had previously issued a stay order on the order.

In its response, the government stated that the transfer order was issued based on administrative requirements and public interest, and was in accordance with the Rajasthan Service Rules.

The High Court subsequently set aside the APO and relieving orders. Advocates Yashpal Khileri and Vinita Changal appeared on behalf of the petition during hearing.

## Jodhpur hospital under scrutiny after wrong injection given to patient

A serious issue has emerged at Goyal Hospital in Jodhpur involving a oatient suffering from advanced spinal cord cancer. The patient, who had been receiving treatment at a private hospital in Mumbai, was advised by relatives to purchase an injection priced at Rs 3,96,000 after consulting with Mumbai based doctors. The relatives managed to collect the funds and buy the injection from Goyal Hospital. However, following administration, the patient's condition worsened significantly, leading to intense pain.

Upon consultation with Mumbai doctors, it was revealed that the injection

given was not the prescribed one, but a different one, exacerbating the patient's condition. When the relatives confronted the hospital, they were reportedly assaulted by hospital & pharmacy staff.

Despite resolving the matter, relatives chose to leave for Mumbai rather than pursue legal action. "If this is case, it is serious and should be probed. I will discuss with highlevel officials & ensure an inquiry," said Ashish Dutt Gajja, DCO.







# PM Modi was instrumental in making Jan Dhan Yojana a thumping success

s India marks 10 years of the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yo-(PMJDY), credit must go to some key suggestions from PM Modi that transformed this initiative into one of the most successful financial inclusion schemes in the world. I was involved in the rollout of the scheme and thus privy to the discussions that went behind closed doors before its implementation and how the invaluable insight of the PM had its deep impact in its success at a time when hardly 35% of the country's adult population had a bank account in his/her name.

- 1. The 'Jhandhe Se Jhandhe **Tak' ambitious target:** During discussions about the scheme's rollout in early 2014, PM Modi asked officials for a target date to cover every household. Officials estimated it would take at least two years, suggesting March 2016 as the completion date. However, PM Modi was disenchanted and said 2 years is a long time. He rather set a much more ambitious goal, captured in the slogan 'Jhande se Jhande tak'—ensuring all Indian families had a bank account between Independence Day 2014 and Republic Day 2015, a span of just 5 months. He said the PM of the country will be behind this mission and the target will be achieved. And surprisingly, this bold target was successfully met under the guidance and monitoring of the PM himself.
- 2. One crore accounts on day one and a Guinness Record: Scheduled for launch on August 28, 2014, PM Modi set the goal of opening 1 crore bank accounts on the very first day. This seemingly unattainable target was not only achieved but surpassed, with over 2.16 crore Jan Dhan accounts opened within the first 3 days of the launch of the scheme. This remarkable accomplishment set the stage for the scheme's future success and



was recognised by the Guinness World Records and Limca Book of Records as a unique and astounding achievement for the speed, efficiency and the sheer number of beneficiaries included at the start.

3. Crowdsourcing the scheme's name: PM Modi has always advocated for Jan Bhagidari (public participation). This was evident in the naming of the Jan Dhan scheme. Recognising the importance of public involvement, he suggested crowdsourcing the name through the MyGov platform,

inviting public suggestions. From thousands of entries, PM Modi chose the name 'Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana', which resonates well with the motto of the scheme.

4. The big launch: To create a grand start, PM Modi recommended holding 75 major events across the country on the launch day, involving state chief ministers, governors, and central ministers to raise awareness about the scheme. This approach generated nationwide excitement, turning PMJDY into a national movement rather than just another government initiative and help greater inclusiveness with largescale participation of beneficiaries.

5. Simplifying the account opening process: One challenge during early stages was cumbersome multi-page bank account opening form which deterred the poor from joining similar government schemes. PM Modi questioned this complexity and suggested simplifying the form to just one page. This straightforward change made it much easier for people to open accounts. When banks ran out of forms due to the overwhelming response, even photocopies of the one-page form were used, demonstrating the power of simplicity and digital transformation in driving widespread adoption. The suggestions from PM were crucial to the seamless and massive rollout of the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, which I was personally witness to. The scheme's success is also a testament to PM Modi's approach of thinking big and aiming high, which is visible in many of his important moves.





# 10 years on, Jan Dhan Yojana remains testament of Modi's decisive leadership

ow long will it take

to ensure that every household has a account through the Jan

Dhan Yojana?" This was the question Prime Minister Modi posed to all the officials before the launch of the Jan Dhan Yojana in 2014. Officials of RBI estimated timeline of 4 years, while his own PMO men said it would take 2 years, and so on. He asked me personally, and I said what I honestly felt that if we put in our best efforts collectively, the target of rollout could be achieved in a year at best. However, PM Modi ensured the target was achieved in just 5 months. Announced on Independence Day in 2014, launched on August, 28, 2014, and the target was finally met before Republic Day in 2015,



bringing nearly 12 crore individuals into the formal banking system in such a short span of practically 5 months. On the completion of a

decade of the Jan Dhan Yojana, this instance stands as a testament to the power of decisive leadership and PM Modi's pursuit for greater efficiency in governance. It was PM's confidence and gumption that led to the stupendous feat what was seemingly impossible to be accomplished in such a short time. There was a centre's financial inclusion scheme earlier too. But the progress was slow and tardy, fraught with red tape delays and logistic hiccups that defeated its purpose. It was PM Modi's personal interest and involvement and his commitment towards the people that gave the scheme a new lease of life, boosted its scope and reach and directly benefitted a large section of the unserved populace who were outside the banking purview for decades.

## PM Modi's ingenuity made the G20 Summit memorable for world leaders

n this day in 2023, India hosted the G20 Summit in New Delhi, marking a significant moment in India's global leadership. Prime Minister Narendra Modi personally oversaw the preparations, offering key recommendations to the organising team to ensure the summit's success. As former foreign secretary and chief coordinator for the G20, I recall one such suggestion from PM Modi which had a significant impact on the event. The summit was initially planned to include an elaborate banquet with a multi-course meal and a grand cultural program featuring over 400 artists pooled from the best from across India. However, after hearing the plan, PM Modi sharing his experience from past G20 summits, said, "See, I have attended eightnine G20 summits, apart from numerous such international events. After long travels and a busy day, leaders arrive at dinner tired and just want to relax and talk to each

other. They prefer to unwind and connect casually, rather than be overwhelmed by extravagant arrangements. They are not left with that kind of energy to focus and pay attention to cultural extravaganza at the day's end. Therefore, my suggestion is to arrange a simple dinner with minimal distractions. A straightforward dinner, maybe with some soft Indian music in the background, will help them interact and relax," he said. This simple logic

had not struck us before. Thereafter, the itinerary was adjusted to be simple and minimalist. The leaders indeed seemed exhausted and many of them came down after 8:30 pm. They just wanted to have their dinner in peace. The Japanese ambassador told me later that at previous G20 summits, leaders often left dinners midway due to exhaustion. However, in Delhi, the dinner went effortlessly, with all leaders staying refreshed until the final course. No one left the assembly in between. This was one reason the New Delhi summit was memorable for all the global leaders, and a large part of the credit for the same goes to the ingenuity of PM Modi. He had caught the pulse of the situation like no one else had and it paid off exactly the way to was envisaged. Anything less or more would have tilted the balance and spoiled the function in some way or the other.

# Cabinet nod for free health cover to all those 70 years and above

he Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Wednesday, took a slew of decisions, including approval for 'Mission Mausam' with an outlay of Rs 2,000 crore over two years and Ayushman health insurance coverage for all senior citizens aged 70 years and above, irrespective of income, under the flagship

scheme.

#### MISSION MAUSAM

The Union Cabinet also approved 'Mission Mausam' to create a more weatherready and climate-smart Bharat with an outlay of Rs 2,000 crore over two years. Mission Mausam is envisaged to be a multifaceted and transformative initiative that will tremendously boost India's weather and climate-related science, research, and services.

The mission's focus will include improving observations and understanding to provide highly accurate and timely weather and climate information across temporal and spatial scales, including monsoon forecasts, alerts for air quality, extreme weather events and cyclones, weather interventions for managing fog, hail, and rain, etc, capacity building and generating awareness.

#### **CONSTRUCTION OF 62,500 KM OF ROADS**

The Union Cabinet approved the Department of Rural Development's proposal to implement the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana-IV from 2024-25 to 2028-29. An official statement said financial assistance will be provided for the construction of 62,500 km of roads to provide new connectivity to eligible 25,000 unconnected habitations and the construction and upgrade of bridges on the new connectivity roads.

#### 31,350 MW HYDROPOWER PROJECTS

The cabinet also approved the development of 31,350 MW hydropower projects with an outlay of Rs 12,461 crore over the next eight years. The scheme will be applicable to all hydropower projects of more than 25 MW capacity including the private sector projects which have been allotted on a transparent basis.

#### PM E-DRIVE SCHEME

The Cabinet approved the PM Electric Drive Revolution in Innovative Vehicle Enhancement (PM E-DRIVE) Scheme with an outlay of Rs 10,900 crore. The scheme will support 24.79 lakh e-2Ws, 3.16 lakh e-3Ws, and 14,028 e-buses. Scheme paves the way for electric ambulances, a crucial step towards integrating EVs into the health sector.

AB PM-JAY is the world's largest publicly funded health assurance scheme which provides health cover of Rs 5 lakh per family annually for secondary & tertiary care hospitalization to 55 cr individuals

ears of sedentary behaviour, such as sitting in an office chair or lazing on a

couch, can have negative longterm health consequences. A recent study suggests that integrating a regular cup of coffee into your daily routine may lessen these detrimental effects.

Researchers from Soochow University in China studied over 10,000 people in the United States. They discovered that drinking coffee daily could guard against the negative consequences of sitting for six or more hours each day. The findings indicate that sedentary coffee consumers are 1.58 times less likely to die from all causes over 13 years than individuals who do not drink coffee but spend equivalent amounts of time sitting.

#### **DOES DRINKING COFFEE MITIGATE THE SIDE EFFECTS OF PROLONGED SITTING?**

The researchers claim that their study is the first to assess the possible health advantages of coffee in reducing the increased risk of death linked with extended sitting. By analyzing nationally representative long-term health data from the United States, the researchers discovered that coffee drinking effectively eliminates the relationship between a sedentary lifestyle and mortality from cardiovascular disease and other causes.

"This is particularly remarkable given that even regular exercise might not fully shield against the long-term health risks of extended sitting, such astype 2 diabetes, heart disease, or stroke," according to the study participants.

Among the 10,639 participants in the study, those who sat for more than eight hours a day had a higher chance of dying from all causes, including cardiovascular disease, than those who sat for fewer than four hours per day. This supports prior studies, but the study discovered a new finding: the health consequences of sitting were considerable "only among adults who did not consume coffee."

Participants who had a sedentary lifestyle and drank coffee had a lower chance of dying from cardiovascular disease, independent of the amount of coffee drunk. Surprisingly, people who consumed more than two and a death than non-coffee drinkers who sat for at least six hours per day.

#### **HEALTH BENEFITS OF COFFEE**


While the study does not provide a definite explanation for why coffee may have this beneficial impact, other research using huge datasets has connected coffee drinking to longer, healthier lives. Caffeine has been linked to a lower risk of developing type 2 diabetes and cardiovascular disease, and even decaffeinated coffee includes antioxidants that may improve metabolism and reduce inflammation. Some chemicals found in coffee may also protect the brain from degenerative disorders like Parkinson's'.

Despite these positive links, more research is needed to determine the precise mechanisms and ideal dosage for the health benefits of coffee. For example, earlier this year, another study discovered that half cups of coffee per day had those with colorectal cancer

er risk of recurrence than those who drank fewer than two cups. Furthermore, three to five cups of coffee per day were connected to the biggest reduction in all-cause mortality, with the advantages diminishing after five drinks.

"Given that coffee is a complex compound, further research is needed to explore this miracle compound," the Soochow University researchers stated.

The study was published in BMC Public Health, and it highlights coffee's potential as a simple yet effective way to prevent the health hazards associated with sedentary living.
