





SIGNIFICANCE OF BANGLADESH FOR INDIA

The country acts as an important corridor for trade and transportation, linking India's Northeast with the rest of the country and facilitating access to international markets.

Bangladesh is India's biggest trade partner in South Asia and India is the second largest trade partner of Bangladesh in Asia A stable and friendly Bangladesh is crucial for regional security. Cooperation on counter-terrorism and other security matters is essential for peace. Ac-

tive collaboration between India and Bangladesh is vital for the success of regional forums like BIM-STEC and SAARC.

MAJOR CHALLENGES FOR INDIA

The nature of the new government, whether it is led by opposition parties or the military will significantly impact India's strategic interests.

A less friendly administration could revive anti-India militant groups, intensifying border tensions. Rising Islamist extremism could increase risks for Hindu minorities. India must manage citizenship promises for Hindu refugees to avoid regional tensions. The political instability in Bangladesh could provide an opportunity for China to expand its influence in the region as Beijing might offer lucrative deals to the new regime.

India's backing of Hasina has created friction with Western allies, specifically the US who have criticised her undemocratic practices .Anti-Bangladesh rhetoric in India and vice versa could hinder relations if not addressed. Bangladesh's turmoil adds to India's challenges, including tensions with Pakistan, instability in Myanmar, strained relations with Nepal, the Taliban's control in Afghanistan, and the Maldives' anti-India stance.

MOVING FORWARD

The major challenge will be avoiding entanglement in internal disputes while maintaining a strong diplomatic presence in Bangladesh, building new alliances with political factions and society, and moving beyond the 1971 liberation narrative. Bolster security along the border and in areas with large Bangladeshi expatriate populations to manage potential spillover effects and maintain stability. Evaluate a Free Trade Agreement and digital connectivity corridor to boost bilateral trade. Leverage strong relations with Gulf countries to support Bangladesh's economy and regional stability. Collaborate with international partners, including the US, UK, and European nations, to counter increased China-Pakistan influence in Bangladesh. India is shifting from non-alignment to focus on national interests and strengthen ties with the US and Japan. Success hinges on maintaining good relations with neighbours, with potential support for Bangladesh again in 2024, as in 1971.

RASHID, JAMAAT GIVE J&K POLL A NEW DIMENSION

he return of Engineer Rashid, an accused in terror-funding, to the political arena in Jammu and Kashmir has injected a new layer of complexity into the upcoming Assembly elections. Released on interim bail, Rashid, also known as Sheikh Abdul Rashid, will campaign actively while awaiting a court decision on his regular bail in October. His association with the banned Jamaat-e-Islami has raised eyebrows, with opposition parties alleging that his release was politically motivated, pointing fingers at the BJP.

40% Independent candidates 'fielded by BJP' to divide votes, claim rivals

More than 40 per cent of the 908 candidates contesting the assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir are Independents, leading to claims that a large number of them have been propped up by the BJP to divide votes.

These are the first assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir since the 2019 abrogation of Article 370 and its reorganisation into two Union territories.

The number of assembly seats has also risen from the earlier 87 to 90 – 47 in the Kashmir Valley and 43 in Jammufollowing a delimitation exercise in 2022.

Palestinian officials say Israeli airstrikes killed 16 people in the Gaza Strip on Monday, including five women and

four children. A strike flattened a home in the built-up Nuseirat refugee camp in central Gaza, killing at least 10 people there, including four women and two children.

The Awda Hospital, which received the bodies, confirmed the toll and also said 13 people were wounded. Hospital records show that the dead included a mother, her child and her five siblings.

OVER 41K PALESTINIANS KILLED SINCE OCT 2023

Gaza's Health Ministry says over 41,000 Palestinians have been killed in the territory since Hamas' Oct. 7 attack triggered the Israel-Hamas war nearly a year ago. The ministry does not differentiate between fighters and civilians in its count but says a little over half of those killed were women and children. Israel says it has killed over 17,000 militants, without providing evidence.

Another strike on a home in Gaza City killed six people, including a woman and two children, according to the Civil Defense.





Debunking Common Myths about Intermittent Fasting

our popular misconceptions regarding the safety of intermittent fasting have been addressed by experts from the University of Illinois Chicago.

Intermittent fasting is becoming a more common approach to reducing weight without watching calories. Furthermore, extensive studies have demonstrated its safety. Nonetheless, some fallacies regarding fasting have gained popularity among clinicians, journalists, and the general public, including the claims that fasting can result in a poor diet or loss of lean muscle mass, create eating disorders, or reduce sex hormones.

UIC researchers refute these claims in a new commentary published in Nature Reviews Endocrinology.

They base their results on clinical investigations, some of which they conducted and others performed.

"I've been studying intermittent fasting for 20 years, and I'm constantly asked if the diets are safe," said lead author Krista Varady, a kinesiology and nutrition professor at UIC. "There is so much misinformation out there. However, those views are not based on science; they are simply personal opinions."



TYPES OF INTERMITTENT FASTING

There are two primary types of intermittent fasting. People who practice alternate-day eating alternate between eating relatively few calories on one day and eating everything they want on the next. People who practice time-restricted eating eat anything they want for four to ten hours each day and then skip meals the rest of the time. Contrary to popular belief, the researchers conclude that both forms are harmless.

INTERMITTENT FASTING DOES NOT RESULT IN A POOR DIET

According to the experts, studies demonstrate that the intake of sugar, saturated fat, cholesterol, fibre, sodium, and caffeine does not vary while fasting compared to previously. Similarly, the percentage of energy consumed in carbohydrates, protein, and fat

remains constant.



Intermittent fasting isn't just another diet fad; it's a fascinating health strategy with remarkable benefits. For starters, it can supercharge your metabolism, turning your body into a fat-burning machine. But the magic doesn't stop there-intermittent fasting trig-

gers a process called autophagy, where your cells actually start to clean and repair themselves, which is believed to slow aging. Studies also show that it can improve heart health by lowering bad cholesterol and even sharpen your brain, boosting focus and memory. With its ability to reduce inflammation and fit into just about any routine, intermittent fasting is more than a way to lose weight—it's a lifestyle upgrade for mind and body.

INTERMITTENT FASTING **DOES NOT CREATE EATING DISORDERS**

> No research has found that fasting causes people to acquire an eating problem. However, all of the

studies excluded participants with a history of eating disorders, and the researchers recommend that those with a history of eating disorders avoid intermittent fasting. They also recommend paediatricians use

caution when monitoring obese teenagers who begin fasting, as this group is at greater risk of developing eating disorders.

INTERMITTENT FASTING DOES NOT RESULT IN AN EXCESSIVE LOSS OF LEAN

Studies demonstrate that people lose the same amount of lean muscle mass whether they fast or follow a different diet. In both circumstances, resistance training and increased protein consumption can help to prevent lean muscle loss.

INTERMITTENT FASTING DOES NOT INFLUENCE SEX HORMONES

Despite concerns regarding fertility and libido, the researchers reported that fasting does not affect estrogen, testosterone, or other associated hormones.


